CITY COUNCIL MEETING—AUGUST 4, 2016

Only two matters were before the City Council at this meeting. The first was the second reading of an Ordinance amending Ordinance 270. The amendment removed any restrictions on the operating hours of marijuana dispensaries and was approved unanimously by the four members present. The City now does not restrict or limit the hours of operation for any retail business in the City.

The second matter was a Resolution reaffirming City Street Standards. Two years ago the City adopted a Resolution whereby all gravel streets would be improved over a six year period. That improvement included proper base and grading, two coats of chip seal and one coat of fog seal. The intent was to provide a far better driving surface while reducing annual street maintenance costs.

The foregoing improvement does not diminish current street standards set by Ordinance 223 and 255. All new construction and rebuilding or improving existing paved streets will be consistent with those standards. The Resolution was approved unanimously by the four members present.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING—AUGUST 18, 2016

Fire Chief Rod Edwards provided an overview of Fire District #4 activity for the first seven months of 2016. Year over year, 2016 to date has seen a greater demand for services than either 2014 or 2015. Medical calls continue to be the big hitter representing about 75% of all calls for service.

Deputy Sheriff Jeff McGrath continues to give a very informative report of activity between Council Meetings. This has been ongoing since Deputy McGrath returned to provide service to Shady Cove. Historically, public safety personnel rotate in and out of Shady Cove on a regular basis, often as frequently as quarterly. Deputy McGrath stated he chooses to continue to provide public safety services to Shady Cove, and the Council is very pleased with that decision.

The City's proposed Ordinance dealing with marijuana growth outdoors was before the Council for a second reading and vote. The Council Chambers were full, with the majority of those in attendance present for this matter. Those who had not provided input, oral or written were offered an opportunity to speak. No one did so, however the relevant points in 5 additional letters were read.

In total, over the last six to seven weeks, the Council has received oral input from 25 citizens and written input from 11. While some folks spoke more than once and/or wrote more than one communication, their input was tallied only once. The final count was 18 to allow for outdoor growth (16 oral, 2 written) and 18 against outdoor growth (9 oral, 9 written). Most of those who supported outdoor growth believed restrictions were prudent.

The Council's deliberation included much discussion and recommendations for some elaboration or clarification in the Ordinance. Specifically, Section 3B now reads "Medical marijuana growers and grow sites shall be exempt from Section 3A4 of this ordinance to the extent they may grow up to, but not more than, six (6) marijuana plants outdoors, on a single tax lot or parcel. All applicable setbacks and other residential zoning provisions shall apply." Section 3A4 states "cultivation, production or processing of marijuana plants shall be within a secure, defined area." Section 3A7 deals with disposal of any excess or unused marijuana ... The added language states "As a means of disposal, burning is prohibited."

Concisely this Ordinance permits the outdoor growth of up to, but not more than, six (6) **medicinal** marijuana plants on a single tax lot or parcel and prohibits any outdoor growth of recreational marijuana plants.

Action on this Ordinance was held over until all five members of the City Council were present. The Ordinance was approved with 4 voting in favor and 1 against. This Ordinance goes into effect on November 15, 2016.
