### Instructions for Circulators

- 1 Only active registered voters of the county, city or district may sign the petition.
- 2 Have signers use a pen when signing petitions. Use a pen when you are certifying petitions.
- 3 Only one circulator may collect signatures on any one signature sheet of the petition.
- 4 You must personally witness all signatures you collect and you should not collect additional signatures on the petition sheet once you have signed and dated the circulator certification.
- 5 It is against the law for circulators to:
  - Circulate a petition containing a false signature.
  - Make false statements to any person who signs the petition or requests information about it.
  - Attempt to obtain the signature of a person who is not qualified to sign the petition.
  - Offer money or anything of value to another person to sign or not sign the petition.
  - Sell or offer to sell signature sheets.
  - Write, alter, correct, clarify or obscure any information about the signers unless the signer is disabled and requests assistance or the signer initials after the changes are made.
  - Accept compensation to circulate a petition that is based on the number of signatures obtained.

**Warning** Violations of the circulator requirements may result in conviction of a felony with a fine of up to \$125,000 and/or prison for up to 5 years.

### Instructions for Signers

- 1 Only active Oregon voters may sign the petition. Sign your full name, as you did when you registered to vote.
- 2 Fill in the date you signed the petition, your printed name and residence address in the spaces provided. Only you may complete your optional information.
- 3 Initial any changes the circulator makes to your printed name, residence address or date you signed the petition.
- 4 Use a pen when signing the petition.
- 5 It is against the law for signers to:
  - Sign another person's name under any circumstances.
  - Sign a petition more than one time.
  - Sign a petition when you are not qualified to sign it.

## Recreational Marijuana Sales

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## PROPOSED ORDINANCE

### AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR MARIJUANA BUSINESSES IN SHADY COVE

WHEREAS, the People of the state of Oregon voted on Measure 91 that the measure's provisions, as described by ORS 475B.010 to 475B.545, were designed to permit persons licensed, controlled and regulated by the state to legally manufacture and sell marijuana to persons 21 years of age and older.

WHEREAS, the People of the City of Shady Cove recognize that the existing ban on recreational sales is a ban on businesses, and not a ban on legal marijuana use nor possession.

WHEREAS, the People of the City of Shady Cove desire to create new jobs, maintain public safety, public health, and develop coordinated businesses.

WHEREAS, the People of the City of Shady Cove may gain access to certain state tax revenues regarding marijuana businesses and up to 3% tax revenues regarding marijuana retail sales.

WHEREAS, the City of Shady Cove may by majority vote of the electors in the City of Shady Cove decide any new prohibition on any marijuana business as per Oregon statute 475B, at the next general election.

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY OF SHADY COVE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

#### SECTION 1

- (1) Shady Cove City Ordinance 277 passed by the City of Shady Cove on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2016, shall be repealed.
- (2) A three (3) percent tax will be imposed on all marijuana sales in the City of Shady Cove.

#### SECTION 2

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on February 19, 2019.
