CITY COUNCIL MEETING—OCTOBER 6, 2016

Meeting was cancelled.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING—OCTOBER 20, 2016

The meeting was opened to a full house with the roll call, pledge of allegiance and announcements by the presiding officer. The meeting was then recessed and a Public Hearing called to order.

The Public Hearing was in the matter of a proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment; and the City of Shady Cove Code of Ordinances to include revisions to the Airpark Commercial Zone. There were no public comments from either proponents or opponents. The Public Hearing was then closed and the regular Council Meeting called back to order. NOTE: The City Council will have a first reading of an Ordinance dealing with this manner at their next meeting on November 3, 2016.

Fire Chief Rod Edwards brought the Council up to date on their activities and announced a Town Hall Meeting on November 15, 2016 at 6:00 PM in the Shady Cove School Gymnasium located at 100 Cleveland Street. The subject is the 2016 Fire Season In Review. Refreshments will be provided. NOTE: Henceforth Chief Edwards will be slated on every City Council Agenda.

A New Business item, discussion of Rogue Air Drive, was moved ahead of Unfinished Business as the majority of the audience was present for that matter. BACKGROUND: The portion of Rogue Air Drive that parallels the runway is owned by the Airpark Association. Some time ago members of the Airpark Board approached City Staff and asked that the City take ownership of the road. Following several discussions, City Staff identified that the gravel road would require improvement before the City would consider assumption of ownership, thus maintenance. The Airpark Board did agree to that provision.

The matter then came before the Council for final determination. The Council agreed that it was in the best interest of all parties for the City to take ownership (after a "warranty" period) of the road once it was improved to the standard the City uses to improve all gravel roads. By motion, the Council, with a unanimous vote of those present, authorized the City Administrator to proceed. Once the details are ironed out, a Resolution will come before the City Council for formal agreement. The Council also said it would be prudent to concurrently improve that portion of the road owned by the City. That is the piece both West and North of that owned by the Airpark Association.

At the September 15th Council Meeting, the City Administrator was authorized to accept an updated agreement with ODOT for improvements to Highway 62 with a completion date extended to mid 2018.

Subsequently the City was provided a copy of the agreement with a completion date of 2019. ODOT staff did say that all construction will be complete by mid 2018 and the extended date is for administrative purposes only. Somewhat skeptically the Council said, by motion, that the September 15th Resolution authorizing the City Administrator to accept the Agreement was still in effect.

A discussion concerning the addition of a second Public Works Employee was continued. Our City Administrator provided the Council with a detailed report concerning the financial impact of hiring a part time employee. There is very little savings over full time, as any employee working 20 hours or more is entitled to all the benefits provided to full time employees. Since the additional employee is needed primarily for safety, emergencies and citizens needs, scheduling of a part time employee would be difficult at best. He also pointed out that cash carried over from last year was significantly more than budgeted. ED. NOTE: This is a result of excellent and prudent financial management by City Staff. A portion of that money could be used to pay an additional employee. However, that money is a one time event and will in all likelihood not increase. Thus an alternate source of revenue should be identified before the City proceeds with a plan to hire an additional employee.

Combined with the foregoing and knowledge that the City now has a second Public Works volunteer, it was agreed to delay consideration of further employment for the short term.

The final item was unanimous approval of a new 3 year Employment Contract for the City Administrator. It was pointed out that this September Mr. Prunty received an excellent Performance Evaluation for the third consecutive year.


